Old timber sleepers recycled back on the project

Leftover timber sleepers from the Narrabri to North Star Phase 1 project that were being considered for community donation have been found to be unsuitable for reuse. Instead, they will be chipped and recycled as mulch for landscaping works along the alignment. Our project team is working to meet sustainability targets by repurposing timber and steel sleepers and steel rail.
